HISTORICAL BACKGROUND: The Jack Russell Terrier was developed nearly 200 years ago in Southern England and were named after Reverend John Russell. These dogs were used for fox hunting.

BREED APPEARANCE: The Jack Russell stands about 10"-15" tall and weighs about 15-18 pounds. This breed is available in shorthair, wirehaired, and broken (a combination of the two). Their coat is mostly white with some black, tan, and/or brown mixed.

WHY YOU WOULD LOVE THIS BREED:

This breed is very intelligent and entertaining. They are very athletic, bold and friendly. They are known to be overly affectionate as well!

WHY YOU WOULD NOT LOVE THIS BREED:

Jack Russell's tend to be hyper and cannot be trusted off-leash. If this breed is bored, it may bark or dig holes.
