HISTORICAL BACKGROUND:

They are considered a designer dog, created from breeding a Pug and a Beagle. They were bred to be a companion and lap dog. They are very popular among the celebrities and families with children or other pets.

BREED APPEARANCE:

They are small with a height of 13 to 15 inches and weighs from 15 – 30 pounds. They are a combination of the two breeds, generally more the Pug size with a longer nose. Their ears are mostly the small triangular shape of the Pug laying close to the head and held somewhat alert. They come in several colors with fawn being the most common.

WHY YOU WOULD LOVE THIS BREED?

They usually like to cuddle and take up little space, so they fit well in apartments and City living. The Puggle is small enough to fit in a litter box saving you the effort of housebreaking him outside.

WHY YOU WOULD NOT LOVE THIS BREED?

The popularity of the breed may have caused indiscriminate breeding. The breeders may not have cared what the parents' temperament or health issues were. Many Puggles may have unstable temperaments due to this problem.
