WHO SHOULD NOT OWN THIS BREED?

This dog was bred to be a companion. You should not own this dog if you don't want to train them or spend time with them.

DO THEY SHED?



Their coat sheds little, or not at all. However, they will need daily grooming and frequent clippings.

WILL THIS BREED BITE MY CHILD?



Schnoodle's should be good with children, but to insure this, they will need training and supervision. However, **EXTREME CAUTION AND SUPERVISION IS ALWAYS RECOMMENDED WHEN CHILDREN AND DOGS ARE TOGETHER!**

WOULD THEY KILL OTHER ANIMALS?



They come from two parents that have the Instinct to retrieve game, so their chase drive is high. Generally, they are good with animals they are raised with.

WHAT IS THEIR ENERGY LEVEL?



They have been bred to be a companion dog but have lots of energy. You need to provide a safe place for them to exercise.

ARE THEY EASY TO TRAIN?



This breed is easy to train. They excel in agility, fly ball, therapy dogs and Lapdog races. They need to have training from puppy hood.

WHAT ARE THE HEALTH CONCERNS?



Their health concerns are Urinary Calculi, eye problems, Canine Melanoma, Autoimmunity and Mycobacterium Avium Infection. Always feed Schnoodles a quality balanced dog food and offer a fresh bowl of water at all times. Buying from a reputable breeder is always advisable and will help to lessen the chances for health problems and congenital defects.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND: The Schnoodle originated about 1995 in the United States from breeding a Poodle to a Schnauzer. They have become quite popular, but are not recognized by the American Kennel Club. There are not many breeders of Schnoodles and finding a responsible breeder will be up to you.

BREED APPEARANCE: There are varying sizes of Schnoodles and there is no standard. The Schnoodle is a cross between the Schnauzer and the Poodle. The parent may be a Toy, Miniature or in Australia a Standard Poodle. The Schnauzer also comes in different sizes. The Toy Schnoodle is about 10 Pounds, and the Miniature is 13 Pounds. The texture of the fur varies from wavy, curly or straight. They have many of the poodle colors.

WHY YOU WOULD LOVE THIS BREED?

They may have a Hypo-allergenic coat, shed less or not at all and usually love to be with people. They are generally a small size which fits well in apartments or city dwellings.

WHY YOU WOULD NOT LOVE THIS BREED?

If improperly bred, they may be overactive dogs that require lots of exercise and attention. They may be very yappy. You may find obedience training a MUST to establish control and have a mannerly dog.
