HISTORICAL BACKGROUND: This breed consists of the Cardigan and Pembroke. They were developed for herding cattle. They nip at the cows' heels, then duck to avoid being kicked.

BREED APPEARANCE: Welsh Corgi's are 10" – 13" and weigh 25 – 30 pounds. They have a long sturdy body on short legs. Colors range from black and tan to fawn.

WHY YOU WOULD LOVE THIS BREED:

Welsh Corgi's are gentle, placid and loving dogs. They love children and crave attention.

WHY YOU WOULD NOT LOVE THIS BREED:

This breed likes to nip at kids' feet. They can be distrustful of strangers and tend to bark a lot.

They are good with other noncanine animals and other corgis. They can be combative with other dogs of a different breed.
